To Whom It May Concern;

On May 1, 2002 I installed a Teflon coated 2" boom valve P/N 75437 S/N 8320 on 502B Air Tractor N60362. The aircraft was flown 863 hours applying mixtures of corrosive and abrasive fungicides and foliar fertilizers on potatoes. The valve was removed, disassembled and inspected on October 1, 2003.

On May 10, 2003 I installed Teflon coated pump P/N 6527 S/N 8745 on 502B Air Tractor N60362. The aircraft has flown 400 hours applying mixtures of corrosive and abrasive fungicides and foliar fertilizers on potatoes. The pump was removed, disassembled and inspected on October 1, 2003.

On May 10, 2003 I installed a Teflon coated 2" boom valve P/N 75437 S/N 8420 on 502B Air Tractor N94ZL. The aircraft was flown 375 hours in the same harsh environment as N60362. The valve was removed, disassembled and inspected October 1, 2003.

These components were reassemble and reinstalled on the aircraft with no maintenance needed and will be used next season. The Teflon stayed on, even on the pump impeller. (See Photos).

I would recommend that my fellow aerial applicators take a serious look at Agrinautics Teflon Coated Products. Teflon allows the applicator to take advantage of the weight savings of aluminum yet having the corrosion resistance of stainless steel.
